## Resolute Forest Products Guidelines for contractors & Visitors:

- Masks must be worn at all times when working onsite.
  - No neck gators are allowed.
- Social distancing must be practiced while onsite.
- If you feel sick or have been around someone who has the symptoms of Covid-19 please stay home and follow your company's protocols for Covid-19.
- If you test positive for Covid-19 you can not return onsite until cleared by a medical professional, negative test and symptom free for more than 48 hours.
- All Covid-19 related issues need to communicated to your RFP contact asap for contact tracing.
- No more than 10 people in a room at one time.

#### **GUIDELINES**

#### ACCESS CONTROL TO RESOLUTE FACILITIES/OFFICES FOR VISITORS AND EXTERNAL SUPPLIERS (COVID-19)

NOTICE: 2020-03-24

Update of the guidelines issued on March 12, 2020, and applicable until a new notice is issued and authorized by Resolute's senior management. The following instructions must be applied:

- All non-essential visits to Resolute facilities/offices by external suppliers making unscheduled sales calls are suspended until further notice.
- 2. All mill tours by external groups are suspended until further notice.
- When service technicians, consultants or Resolute employees from outside your facilities/offices are required in your facilities, they must be asked:
  - If they have traveled outside the province/state in the last 14 days or could have been exposed to cases of COVID-19.
  - b. If they have shown any symptoms related to COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- Truck drivers/delivery personnel:
  - Ensure additional hand-sanitizing stations are provided in waiting rooms/areas.
  - Post recommended measures to help reduce the spread of the virus and for effective handwashing.
  - Maintain social distancing of at least 2 meters (6 feet).
  - d. If truck drivers/delivery personnel need to be in direct contact with Resolute employees, they must be asked:
    - If they have travelled outside the province/state in the last 14 days using public transportation (plane, train, cruise ship ONLY).
    - If they could have been exposed through close contact within 2 meters (6 feet) to cases of confirmed or presumed COVID-19.
    - iii. If they have shown symptoms related to COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
    - iv. If one of these criteria is met, the truck driver/delivery personnel MUST NOT be allowed onsite, but may leave the material delivered outside the site when applicable.
